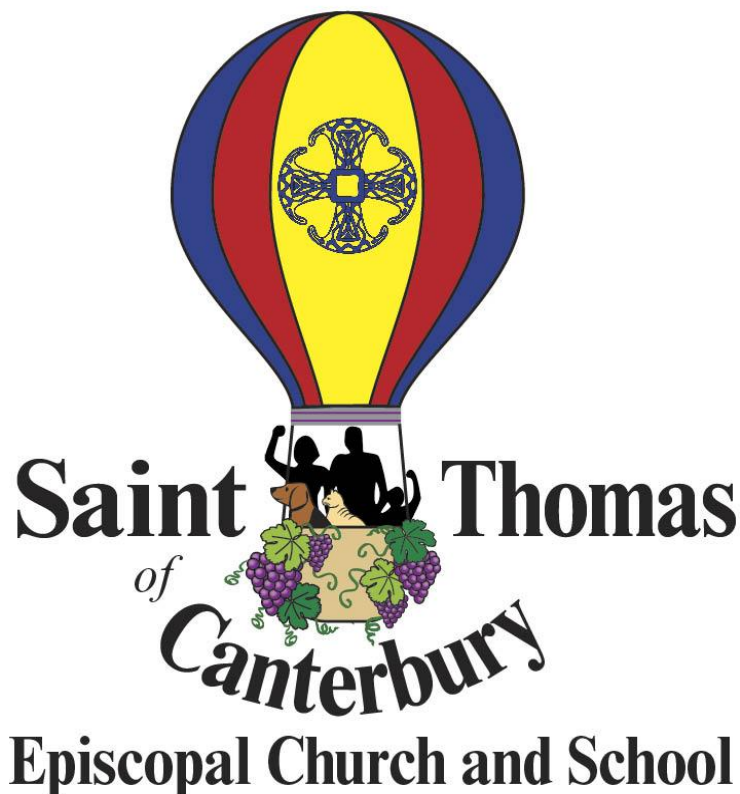

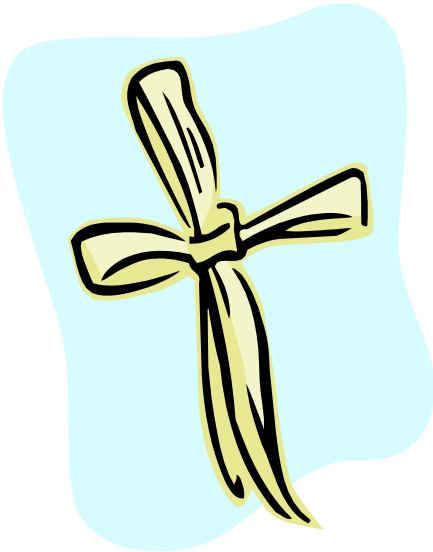


## EASTER FLOWERS
