### **Women of Worth (WoW)**

The Women's Ministry group at St. Thomas of Canterbury Episcopal Church was started/re-started on September 2, 2017 by Andrea Liesman. The group was started as a service group to help with events such as funerals, weddings, special occasions and fellowship. WoW members have participated in a wide variety of events and services.

With gratitude for Andrea's efforts to start the group, in February 2019 there was a change in Leadership with Virginia Patton, BC Hospitality taking over the reins. Doria Lore became co-leader shortly thereafter. The group meets on the fourth Saturday of each month at 9:00 am in Julian Hall with prayer, breakfast and time for fellowship and planning for upcoming events. Recently we have spent time getting to know each other better with ice breaker topics which provide an avenue to know each other on a more personal level. We have decided to have more fun with special outings quarterly. Recently the group had brunch at the Grand Tradition in Fallbrook and toured the Temecula Olive Oil Company Tree Farm and other sites in Aguanga.

In addition WoW wants to give back to the community. Andrea Liesman coordinated an outreach project aimed at assisting those in our community in the most need, the homeless. Through Project T.O.U.C.H., St. Thomas members and Preschool families were encouraged to fill a bag with one item a day during Advent from a list of needs. This program was called "Reverse Advent" to reflect giving instead of getting. We plan on additional community projects in the future.

All women of St. Thomas are members and we hope to have more women attend the meetings and activities. Being involved with WoW allows women to grow in their faith, develop new friendships and have some fun in the process.

### **Upcoming Training in 2020**

We're patient, we're persistent and we have the skills to make life better for other people. What we need is people willing to help us do it. It takes commitment and training. We can provide the training. You need to dig deep and say "yes, this is important enough that I will make a 50 hour commitment to learning the skills that will make me a Stephen Minister and a better human being. We also meet every two weeks to learn new skills and share praise notes with each other confidentially. For a class to form we need a minimum of four trainees. We currently have one application.

Oh and by the way, we need at least one man. The reason for this is that the Stephen Ministry doesn't allow cross-gender counseling. They've been around about 50 years and I guess they've learned that sometimes that can cause more complications than solutions.

Stephen Ministry gradually reshapes you into an even more wonderful human being than you already are. I know that sounds improbable but it's true. You become a better listener, a kinder human being, and a caring friend, the training has a positive impact on all the relationships in your life.

I'd also like to thank all the members of our wonderful Stephen Ministry team at St. Thomas, including our leader, Deb Mitchell, our four wonderful ministers, Elena Gimpel, Suzie Grindle, Lani-Karyn Jones and Jo Anne Dreyfus. We also had a fifth minister, Peter Hicks who completed his training just before he and his wife moved to Arizona. He is now a Stephen Minister at his new church. So we have sewn the seeds and they have taken root.
