## **Stephen Ministry**

### **Upcoming Training in 2020**

We're patient, we're persistent and we have the skills to make life better for other people. What we need is people willing to help us do it. It takes commitment and training. We can provide the training. You need to dig deep and say "yes, this is important enough that I will make a 50 hour commitment to learning the skills that will make me a Stephen Minister and a better human being. We also meet every two weeks to learn new skills and share praise notes with each other confidentially. For a class to form we need a minimum of four trainees. We currently have one application.

Oh and by the way, we need at least one man. The reason for this is that the Stephen Ministry doesn't allow cross-gender counseling. They've been around about 50 years and I guess they've learned that sometimes that can cause more complications than solutions.

Stephen Ministry gradually reshapes you into an even more wonderful human being than you already are. I know that sounds improbable but it's true. You become a better listener, a kinder human being, and a caring friend, the training has a positive impact on all the relationships in your life.

I'd also like to thank all the members of our wonderful Stephen Ministry team at St. Thomas, including our leader, Deb Mitchell, our four wonderful ministers, Elena Gimpel, Suzie Grindle, Lani-Karyn Jones and Jo Anne Dreyfus. We also had a fifth minister, Peter Hicks who completed his training just before he and his wife moved to Arizona. He is now a Stephen Minister at his new church. So we have sewn the seeds and they have taken root.
