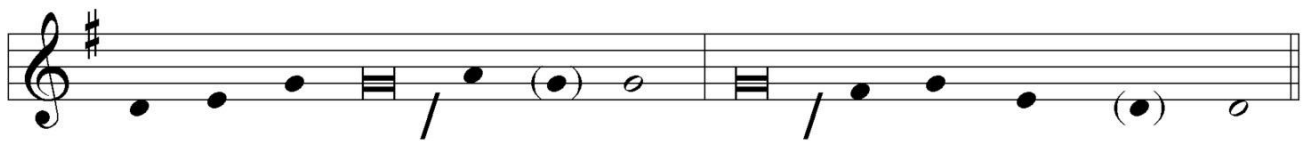

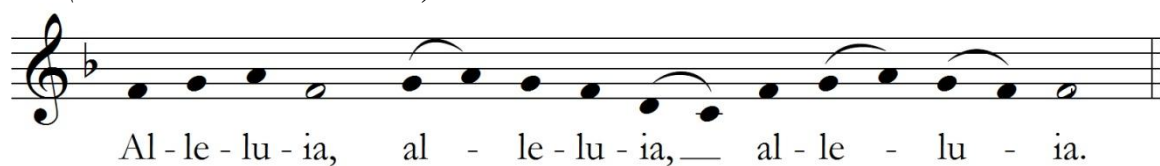

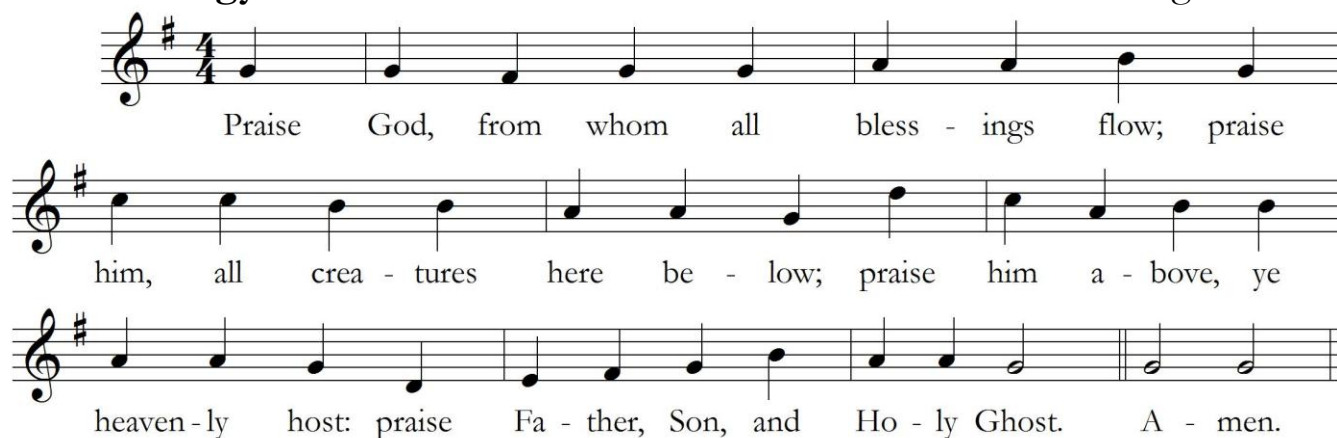

Learn Centering Prayer

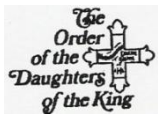
