MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM VICAR

It is late June and St. Thomas is in the swirl of transition activities. The responses from the Congregational Assessment Tool, better known as the CAT, have been reported to the Bishop's Committee and all are invited to participate in a "Congregational Meeting" on July 10th to learn more and engage in conversation about plans to secure the next Vicar of St. Thomas.

The formation of a Profile Committee and a Search Committee is underway. These are essential ingredients of transition, i.e., "bridge" time between the old and the new, the past and the future. "Bridge" time is an active period to assess the past, live in the present, and plan for the future. As your Interim Vicar, I am greatly enjoying this ministry of transition. The level of commitment from volunteers is very impressive--without which St. Thomas could not thrive. Allow me to congratulate you on the caliber of commitment and the healthy spirit of community which keeps on building.

RAINBOW BRIDGE -- I drive North on the I-15 to get to church and always marvel at the bridge that spans west and east high above the freeway. It is commonly called the "Rainbow Bridge" because of its unique design and proximity to the community of Rainbow, where a number of parishioners from St. Thomas live (its official name is Lilac Road Bridge).

Every time I see this bridge I associate it with St. Thomas. That bridge symbolizes the transition the St. Thomas community is experiencing. The beauty of



the bridge comes from its strength, its endurance, and its ability to connect the west and the east over the 15. It has a beginning, middle, and end, just like "bridge time" or transition time when a church is in-between its long-term pastorates. We can have continued fruitful dialogue about the nature of this "bridge time" as St. Thomas progresses in its search.

PRAYER -- I ask you to commit to pray for those who will be serving on the Profile and Search Committees, and for the leadership of St. Thomas. Pray to the Holy Spirit for wisdom and spiritual discernment in the process.

Keep current with your pledges please during this summer period and beyond to support the ministries of St. Thomas and the extra needs brought about by the nature of being in a search process. Prayer and pledges matter!

SERVANTS OF GOD / OUTREACH






CHRISTIAN EDUCATION for YOUTH YOUTH CONFIRMATION CLASSES






BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP



This month, let's talk about a few basic ideas concerning our health and how to improve it.

The newest 2016 guidelines for all Americans and our general diet have recently been updated by the departments of agriculture and health and human services. These are pretty simple suggestions and make total common sense.

A little more than two out of every three of us (almost 70%) are overweight.

Obesity is directly associated with heart attacks and strokes. Additionally, being overweight makes it harder for us to exercise. Therefore, to improve our health we should begin by lowering our weight and decreasing our dietary sugars. This is a first step in reaching a healthy lifestyle.

As far as sugar is concerned, 50 grams equals our maximum sugar intake for a 2000-calorie diet each day. One teaspoon of sugar equals approximately 4 grams whereas one 12-ounce soda equals 40 to 50 grams (the limit). The answer: drink water, no-calorie drinks, black coffee, or unsweetened tea. Fruit, such as apples, grapes, blueberries, and melons, in the afternoon, should become the snack of choice instead of those other things! It is amazing to me that sweetened beverages have become the greatest source of added sugars in the average U.S. diet.

So, if we commit to 30 minutes of daily exercise (walking is great) five days per week and decrease our sugar intake, this simple process makes a great first step to achieving better health. There are dozens of fad diets and pills out there, but this free and simple plan will get us all started!

Remember: (1) decrease daily sugar
(2) increase exercise
