The Great Litany

The Great Litany is a responsive intercession for a wide variety of human needs. Its beginnings are in fifth century Rome where it was connected with both processions for obtaining God's blessing on the fields and for God's defense against enemies as disasters. Martin Luther made a popular revision of the Great Litany in 1529 that was influential in England. The Great Litany was the first English language rite prepared by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer published in 1544. Cranmer modified the Great Litany by consolidating certain groups of petitions into single prayers with response. The Great Litany has become a classic Christian prayer, one that is powerful and insistent.
