



## SUGGESTIONS FOR GERMAN DISHES TO BRING ALONG FOR THE GERMAN- THEME POT LUCK

NOTE: It is not necessary to bring a German Dish...Just bring along something that you think goes well with Brats and Dogs. But if you would like to bring along something German, here are some suggestions for you to consider.

### Side Dishes:

1. Deutsche Bretzel (German Pretzels)
2. Sauerkraut
3. Rotkohl (Red Cabbage)
4. Gruene Bohnensalat (Green Bean Salad – with butter, dill, beef bouillon)
5. Geduenstetes Weisskraut (skillet prepared cabbage with celery, green pepper, onion, in veg oil)
6. Kohl Westfaellishe (cabbage cooked in skillet with caraway seeds, beef broth, tart apples, corn starch)
7. Karotten in Bier geduenstet (carrots cooked in dark beer and sugar)
8. Kartoffelnpannkuchen (German Potato Pancakes)
9. Warmer Kartoffelsalat (Hot German Potato Salad)
10. Spaetzle (German Noodles – can be easily boiled and then mushroom or brown gravy added)
11. Kaesespaetzle (German Noodles boiled, then baked with Swiss Cheese and Onion)
12. Kartoffelkloesse (German Potato Dumplings – can be bought in packets at World Market – with gravy)

## **Salads:**

1. Schnittbohnsensalat (Green Bean Salad – with vinegar and sugar)
2. Rote Ruebensalat (Red Beet Salad)
3. Rotkrautsalat (Red Cabbage Salad)
4. Guerkensalat (Cucumber Salad)
5. Kalter Deutscher Kartoffelsalat (Cold German Potato Salad)
6. Bayerischer Wurstsalat (Bavarian Sausage Salad – uses Knockwurst pieces with sweet pickle, onion, vinegar, paprika, Dijon Mustard)

## **Desserts:**

1. Apfelfannenkuchen (German Apple Pancakes)
2. Apfelstrudel
3. Berliner Krapfen (What we call “Jelly Donuts”)
4. Schwarzwaelder Kirschtorte (German Black Forrest Cherry Cake)
5. German Chocolate Cake
6. Swabian Flaedle ueberbacken (Swabian Pancakes)
7. Hazelnusstorte (Hazelnut Tart)
8. Stollen (German Christmas Cake from Dresden...usually out before Christmas; could perhaps be found at World Market or TJ's)
